

5 Year Rule

Please note that if the designation is not earned within five years, the course credits will expire, and the course must be repeated to meet the program requirements, where applicable. If the expired course no longer exists in the program's current curriculum, the student must take a new course to complete the program. If the designation program is completed within five years, the course credits become permanent on the student's transcript and may be applied at a later date toward the fulfilment of requirements for other designation programs, if the course is part of the program's current curriculum.
